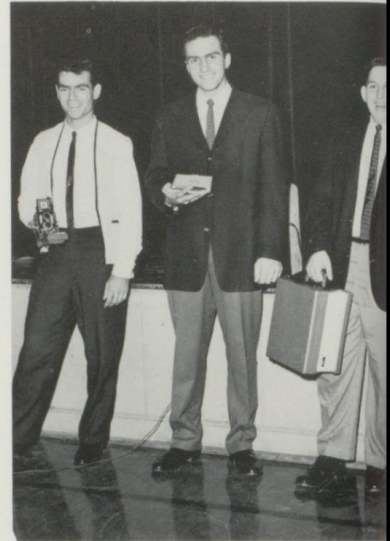
SENIOR MAGAZINE PARTY
